A picture speaks a thousand words. A 'photo essay' is a series of photographs that tell a story. We hope that with this event we stretch our visual imagination and creative limits to explore new and novel ways to connect and engage with people and the environment.

Pictures for Progress

PROMPT:

Participants should adopt a **solution oriented approach** to explore **one** of the following themes and centre their work around the same. The photo essay should be a collection of upto of 20 photos and all captions, and descriptions combined should be no more than 1500 words

Themes:

- 1. **Overconsumption** [explore how human overconsumption is unnecessary, excessive and leads to waste- solutions and/or sensitisation]
- 2. **Sustainability** [track the status quo of an industry and imagine this industry in a ecotopian future]
- 3. Interaction between humans and biodiversity [look at minute interactions between humans and nature, for example, mosquitoes in your room or plant growing out of a building]
- 4. **Global Citizenship** towards collective climate action [focus on collaborative efforts towards reducing carbon footprints-approach from any of various lenses of schools, industries and governments]
- 5. Food Waste [ways to prevent or sensitisation about]

ABOUT THE EVENT:

Zines are informal publications that have historically played an integral role in sensitisation and driving change.

Sometimes, zines can be a little hard to define- but that's what makes them great: they're a glorious mash-up of art, stories and emotion- much like the themes they seek to explore!

They're a powerful outlet for content considered to be too niche or outside of the mainstream, in terms of more traditional/commercial forms of publication.

Their small, simple format belies their unique ability to speak creatively [and loudly] for even the softest voices.

Through this event we hope to capture the spirit of change makers and propel the cause of climate justice.

Below 10	Poster: Public Announcement/ Call to Action , for eg: Don't Litter/ Recycle			
10-12	Poster as an Informational Guide for schools or communities you live in, eg: Wet Waste vs Dry Waste, Water Conservation, Composting, Reduce Plastic Use, etc			
12-14	Informational Zine that contextualises and explains the significance of their topic, eg: Why and How should one Recycle?			
14-16 & 16- 18	Call for Mobilization around any ONE environmental concern by presenting a problem statement, explaining the causes and IMPACT of the concern, and providing alternative/conscious ways to solve the problem Suggested topics: Fast Fashion, Food Waste, EcoAgriculture, Industries and the Environment, Disposal Systems such as global landfills

All posters and zines must be submitted as PDFs. The zines **must follow a folio format**. This publication by The Public is an excellent introduction to zines. Click here to read it.

We'd like to encourage you to use a variety of mediums. You have the creative freedom to make these posters/ zines on paper, digitally or even use a hybrid of both!

Please remember to include your name, date of publication and other relevant information.

Rubrics:

ABOUT THE EVENT:

Writing as a device to spread awareness and bring about change has an impactful and effective technique to employ.

H.O.P.E. 2021 prompts are sure to challenge your grey cells and give the readers some very thought provoking ideas to ponder upon.

We encourage you delve into environmentalism and explore amelioration practices from around the world and contextualise them to your prompt.

We look forward to reading your creative and original ideas that contextualise existing research and practices to your setting.

AGE	PROMPTS
Below 10	Why is the environment important to you and what should your local community do/ what has it done to be more eco friendly? [collection of ideas to implement] Word Limit: 500 words
10-12	Describe what a <u>sustainable and eco conscious utopia</u> looks like to you. How can we achieve this? You can include existing practices! Word Limit: 500 words
12-14	How can schools/ localities propell the cause of and be starting points for sustainability movements and what have they done? Word Limit: 1000 words
14-16	How should societies switch to sustainable renewable energy based economies? Word Limit: 1000 words
16-18	How can we strengthen institutions to extend environmental rights and make environmentally conscious governance a norm? Word Limit: 1500 words

Policy Dialogue

Policy Dialogues are deliberative conferences where stakeholders can discuss complex aspects of an issue in an organised form. Policy Dialogues seek to exchange ideas to form a consensus on policy recommendations.

The objective of the policy dialogue will be to come up with recommendations for policy changes for making schools sustainable:

- Theme 1: "Mapping future obstacles: Reimagining Energy and Transport in a Carbon-Neutral Future"
- Theme 2: "Discussing the True Oceanic Crisis: Scrutinizing Pollution Caused by the Fishing Industry"

OTHER GUIDELINES:

This will be a simulation workshop where participants will represent some of the key parts of school ecosystem.

You have to come up with challenges and solutions to address the theme areas. You will be assigned the theme, one stakeholder relating to the topic, and a point of view to match it before the event.

Even before the event day, you will get a chance to first network with others with the same theme and point of view to start developing strategies for driving discussions on the event day.

* Only 30 participants will be participating in the event, and entries will be on a **first-come-first-serve** basis.

Rhythm n' Rhymes

Poetry conveys one's thoughts and reveals beautiful scenes, stories, and fictions, in a lyrical and rhythmic arrangement of words.

Poems can be both structured, filled with rhymes, rhythms, and a set meter, and be freeform, following no formal structure.

Poetry is an outlet to spark change, a powerful method of communication, tending to be short and rousing that is easy to grasp for most people.

We hope this event brings forth the poet within you. Participants can express their emotions, and impact the audience to stimulate a change for sustainability, and Heal Our Planet Earth!

OTHER GUIDELINES:

All submissions must be submitted as PDF Documents with no formatting (with the exception of bold, italics, underlines and text alignment). The poem must follow the specified type (given above in italic with the topics). Submissions may be written, but it is not recommended (Written submissions must be on a white sheet of paper with blue/black ink for legibility.)

We encourage conducting research and ideating for the poem, but do not condone plagiarism. Work submitted must be original and created only by the participant.

Rubrics:

Participants can expect adjudicators to consider their poems on the basis of originality in perspective, relevance to the theme, coherence of ideas, clarity of the poem.

Sustainable Innovations

12-14	Students will submit any Sustainable Innovation of their choosing, and no theme will be specified.

	The submissions will be in the form of a product proposal

The submissions will be in the form of a product proposal presentation, with details of the idea, implementation (if applicable), merits and demerits of the product, and pictures / schematics of the product.

If possible a physical prototype would also be looked upon favourably (although no points would be deducted for the same), however, a design in form of a CAD design will also be accepted

Rubrics:

Participants can expect adjudicators to consider their submissions based on: impact of product, written communication via the presentation, thoroughness of background research and aesthetic of the presentation. You can learn more by clicking here.

A Call for Lesson Plans

We firmly believe that education is the first step towards collective action for climate mitigation. With this in mind, we'd like you to submit lesson plans that teach environment consciousness. Select plans will be featured in a first-of-its-kind published emagazine.

Participation is open to everyone from students, teachers and anyone else passionate about educating and the environment)

We recommend including the following:

- Abstract and Key terms
- A brief description of the lesson objectives
- A statement on why your plan is unique and what differentiates it
- Time required to conduct the lesson
- Recommended age group
- A detailed lesson plan
- Interactive activities to reinforce teaching
- Resources such as powerpoints/ handouts if any
- Further extensions to the lesson
- Additional readings
- Reflections, learnings and other media from class (if the lesson has been conducted before)
